

# UPSTATE'S ELITE

### This guide takes a close look at 67 Upstate colleges; these are the 10 that meet a trio of imposing standards

To rate or not to rate? That truly is the question.

Business First is not shy about ratings. Our weekly lists rank everything from Western New York's largest banks to its busiest hospital emergency departments. And we've issued annual rankings of local elementary and secondary schools since 1992.

But colleges are different. Pupils face the same curricular requirements through 12th grade, yet college students must choose from dozens and dozens of majors. That's why we designed this publication not as a rating guide, but as an overview of

Upstate New York's vast array of educational options.

You'll find detailed statistical profiles of all 22 undergraduate schools (both four-year and two-year programs) in the eight counties of Western New York, along with all 45 four-year colleges scattered across the other 40 Upstate counties.

These institutions offer something for everyone. Are you looking for a large school? Or something small? Urban? Rural? Public? Private? Several colleges on these pages meet each of these criteria.

They also run the gamut in terms of selectivity and difficulty, which is why we (slightly) bent our prohibition on ratings. We have winnowed the field of four-year Upstate schools to the

institutions that share these elevated qualities:

- ▶ They are selective, with fewer than 50 percent of their applicants being admitted.
- ▶ They are retentive, with more than 85 percent of their freshmen returning for a second year.
- ► They are persistent, with more than 80 percent of their students making it all the way to graduation.

Precisely 10 Upstate schools – the Elite 10, if you will – have reached all three of these benchmarks, according to the latest figures from the National Center for Education Statistics. You can see breakdowns of all 10 colleges below.

The Elite 10 have something else in common. All are based outside of Western New York.

Three are located in the Albany area (Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Skidmore and Union colleges), and five more are in Central New York (Binghamton, Colgate, Cornell and Syracuse universities and Hamilton College). Rounding out the group are St. Lawrence University in the North Country and the University of Rochester, the closest Elite 10 school to Buffalo.

Four Western New York colleges met one of the three requirements for elite status. Alfred State College, the University at Buffalo, Niagara University and St. Bonaventure University have retention rates higher than 85 percent.

But no school in the eight-county area has an admission rate lower than 50 percent or a graduation rate higher than 80 percent.





If you're hunting for college rankings, you have no shortage of targets.

Several national publications and websites generate annual lists of America's best schools. Each has its own distinct criteria, and each has a slightly different take on the educational experience. A quick Google search will prove the point.

Three of these services (Forbes, Kiplinger's and U.S. News and World Report) stand above the others in reputation and experience. We've collected their latest lists below, along with the public college rankings produced by Business First at the beginning of April.

All of these standings are worth studying. But none, of course, is the final word. Consider them a good starting point as you study the options




### **BUSINESS FIRST**

The publication you're currently reading doesn't rank Upstate colleges, yet Business First remains involved in the rating process on a different level.

We issued our annual rankings of the nation's public colleges earlier this month. The full report, available on our website (*www.bizjournals.com*), encompasses 499 taxpayer-supported institutions in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

We created a 22-part formula to identify America's best public colleges. It gives the top scores to schools





with highly selective admissions processes, strong retention and graduation rates, affordable tuitions and housing costs, diverse faculties and student bodies, and economically robust communities.

### **FORBES**

This business magazine takes a predictably businesslike approach to its college rankings, focusing on a student's potential return on investment.

Here's what its methodology says: "We look at factors that directly concern students (and their families): Are current undergrads satisfied? Is it likely I'll graduate on time or incur a ton of student debt? Will I get a good job and be a leader in my chosen profession?"

The U.S. college that does the best job of meeting these criteria, according to Forbes, is Stanford University. The national runners-up are Williams College and Princeton University.

Upstate's top entry is Cornell University, which is 29th overall. You can find the complete standings at www. forbes.com.

Binghamton University is Upstate's top-rated public university, according to separate rankings by Business First, Kiplinger's and U.S. News and World Report.

### **KIPLINGER'S**

Value is the holy grail for Kiplinger's Personal Finance, a monthly magazine that offers advice on investing, money managing and retirement planning.

Kiplinger's turns its attention to higher education once a year, celebrating the schools that "best meet our definition of value: a quality education at an affordable price."

It releases three separate lists, naming the 100 public colleges, 100 private universities and 100 private liberal-arts colleges that meet its criteria for quality and value.

The three current U.S. leaders are the University of North Carolina, Princeton University and Swarthmore College. Binghamton, Cornell and Hamilton College respectively hold the top Upstate positions. Details are available at www.kiplinger.com.

### **U.S. NEWS AND WORLD REPORT**

We finish this review with the field's dominant player. U.S. News and World Report was the first magazine to issue annual college rankings – a genre it created in 1983 - and its standings still attract more attention than those of any other publication.

Its report, once confined to a simple list or two, has grown more complicated with the passage of time. U.S. News boasts that it now provides "nearly 50 different types of numerical rankings and lists to help students narrow their college search."

Four are of particular relevance here. Two are for schools that are nationally oriented (national universities and national liberal-arts colleges) and two are for smaller schools with regional bases (Northeast universities and Northeast colleges).

Princeton University (universities) and Williams College (liberal-arts colleges) hold first place on the national lists, with Cornell as Upstate's frontrunner on the former and Colgate University and Hamilton tied on the latter.

The regional rankings are headed by Providence College (universities) and Cooper Union (colleges), with Ithaca College and Cazenovia College as the respective Upstate leaders. You can get more information at www.usnews. com.




