ORDER

Before the Court are Defendants' Motion to Introduce Evidence (ECF No. 265), filed January 16, 2022; and Government's Response (ECF No. 267) filed January 17, 2022. For the reasons that follow, the Court finds this Motion should be, and is, **DENIED**.

The Court previously found Kyle Bass evidence should be excluded pursuant to Rule 401 and 403. Order 6, ECF No. 137. Defendants now seek reconsideration of that order, claiming the Government's questioning of witnesses have opened the door to this evidence. The Court finds Defendants have failed to show the Court's prior ruling on this issue should be changed. First, a review of the trial transcript does not show the Government has opened the door to this evidence. Second, and more importantly, Defendants have not shown that the decision to delist UDF was a result of the Kyle Bass information. Thus, after reviewing the parties' briefing and the attached exhibits, Defendants Motion is **DENIED**.
