RE: Community and Business Leaders Express Strong Support for CapRadio and KVIE Integration

As dedicated community and business leaders who care deeply about the health and prosperity of the Sacramento region, we are writing to express our strong support for the proposed integration of Capital Public Radio (CapRadio) and our local public television station, KVIE. We believe this partnership makes good sense and ask that you strongly consider the many benefits that integrated operations would provide Sacramento State, our region's public media landscape, and the listening audience, all while ensuring long-term stability for public broadcasting in our community.

Community owned and operated matters. The risk of losing traditional broadcast listeners and viewers to nearby competition is a real threat and could lead to troubling declines in members and supporters. Moreover, the possibility of San Francisco's KQED subsuming our treasured local radio station is not inconceivable. Longevity of CapRadio and KVIE would be strengthened if, like KQED, they operated as one entity with an integrated strategic plan and one community-based governing board.

The tough economic headwinds facing all media are a real and present threat. Newsrooms throughout the U.S. are laying off journalists, closing news bureaus, and dramatically reducing their commitment to government and public policy reporting – all when the state of our democracy needs it more than ever. Together, CapRadio and KVIE would have the opportunity to combine strengths and enhance the quality, reach, and relevance of our region's public service broadcasting.

**KVIE's long record of success means that a merged entity will have a firm foundation on which to grow and flourish.** KVIE offers first-rate national and local programming, owns its facility debt-free, has a strong board of directors, and accomplished leadership. By joining public TV with radio and digital platforms, the merged entity would become a more powerful platform that better serves the community, bolsters future investments, attracts and retains top talent, and results in a more robust news-gathering organization.

Joint community ownership of public broadcasting is a successful model across the nation. Cities like Boston, Dallas, Philadelphia, Portland, San Francisco, and others have robust integrated media platforms. Sacramento could be and deserves to be among those markets with proven and effective working models.

A merged media outlet is good for Sacramento State. Integrating CapRadio with KVIE will allow Sac State to focus on its educational mission, without diminishing opportunities for student engagement. We recognize and appreciate the university for providing critical support during a challenging time, but oversight of CapRadio has proven to be expensive, difficult, and distracting for campus leadership and a drain on university resources.

In sum, we firmly believe that an integrated public media outlet is a smart business decision and can be a win for all parties – CapRadio and KVIE, their listeners and viewers, Sac State, and most importantly our communities.

We understand that there is value in the licenses of CapRadio. We urge you to explore the options and engage in meaningful conversations with community leaders and investors to see how we can work together to make this happen for our region.
