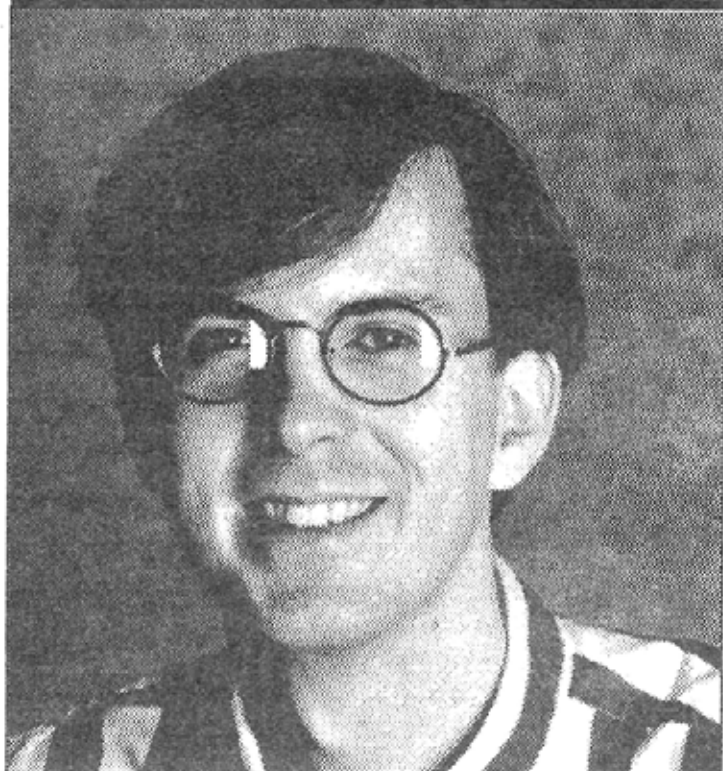


KEVIN LYNCH

Mr. Lynch grew up in Chicago and studied computer graphics at the University of Illinois at Chicago from 1984 to 1986.

While still in school, he co-founded Challenger Software, which developed software for Apple Computer Inc.'s Macintosh computer.

Mr. Lynch came to California to join Frame Technology Corp., where he designed the user interface for the first Macintosh version of FrameMaker.

He was recruited to General Magic Inc. by co-founder Andrew Hertzfeld in 1992. There, he helped design Magic Cap, the software used as an operating system for handheld computers. As director of Magic Cap development, he has roughly 50 of General Magic's 200 employees working under his guidance.

• *10-year plan:* Mr. Lynch would like to return to the start-up universe. "I plan to be a few years into a startup that I'd helped launch, most likely related to human interface design."

• *Best idea:* "I don't think I've had my best idea yet." Pressed to choose one, he'd select the Magic Cap navigation metaphor, which groups computer functions into pictorial "scenes" such as a desktop, a corridor or a downtown area.
